



Thank you for supporting Aramiac Bible Translation (ABT). Your gifts bring God's Word to people who have suffered-are still suffering-displacement and persecution due to religious discrimination.

Because ABT teams are used to working remotely, work has continued largely uninterrupted by COVID-19. According to ABT Executive Director Rob Hilbert, "the projects are moving at a strong pace."

Research and study of language patterns and word forms has been a major focus. The teams work with several languages and the dialects found within those language groups. Previous translations and resource materials show a lack of conformity in spelling and grammatical structure. Eastern script (Syriac) is sometimes used, in other cases a Western (Latin) style script. There has been significant progess in creating a database that will assist translators to track discrepancies between previous manuscripts and determine how to best communicate the Gospel message to each unique language community through new translations.

In the coming months, using their new understanding of language patterns, the teams will check completed Scripture portions and determine which books of the Bible to translate next.
