The first draft of Luke is under review. Work continues on Acts. Rev. Domisian Alloys is now serving as Assistant Translation Coordinator. The team is transitioning to the use of Paratext, the standard in translation software. Discussions are underway to establish a Kerewe translation committee to assist in planning, review, and community relations.

Though COVID-19 caused the cancellation of several community awareness activities, Kerewe speakers are learning about the translation project—and they are elated!

"The woman who printed the Luke draft copies is looking forward to one day having her own copy of the Kewere New Testament," reports Rev. Andrew Olson. "She and many others received news about the project with great jubilation."
