Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Thirteen days in quarantine, family matters, 3,200-word assignments and lots of prayer... That is just a glimpse of what the last five weeks have looked like for me here at Moorlands. Tears from sorrows (and laughter!), frustrations with learning online and in-person alike, deepening relationships with classmates and then saying goodbye to some at the end of their courses - all of this and more made for a long, hard, and yet rewarding month of October and beginning of November. And despite all of the ups and downs, I have a lot to be thankful for! I am also beginning a new course: Scripture Engagement, but here are some highlights



Quarantine: We had a couple of positive covid cases in our class, so beginning on Oct. 8th we were immediately ordered to go into isolation in our dorm rooms. It was a whirlwind of emotions over what turned into almost two weeks, and my five hallmates and I had to learn to adapt quickly and work together as a family unit.

Fortunately, we had many friends and classmates who took care of us from the outside by giving us care packages, delivering our meals, and doing any necessary shopping for us here and there. I was beyond blessed to be quarantined with my hallmates as well, some of whom I have become even closer with and two visitors I otherwise would not have come to know so well!

Family and Home Life: Trying to balance life as a student in England while also keeping track of friends and family back home is an exceptionally difficult challenge! Fortunately, I have an amazing family who keeps me informed when family members are sick or in need of prayer and when there are occasions worth celebrating too! Even though it is hard to come by, there is always time when I need it to call my sister or mom just to have a quick chat. Once in a while I get a little homesick, but remembering why I am here and thinking about the wonderful connections I am making and lessons I am learning helps me to keep smiling! And thanks be to God that he has given me a resemblance of family in the community that I am finding here at Moorlands! This gives me hope that in the future, no matter where I go, God will provide a circle of friends and "family" to sustain me and help in my life overseas.

As I did in my last newsletter, I would love to share with you some things that I have learned in the last five weeks through classes and my experience here in England:

- Expect the Unexpected: Just like quarantine, assignment deadlines, and rainfall on what looks to be a sunny day, life can throw a curveball at you at any given moment. I'm learning that God has a rhyme and reason for everything, even rainy days. You end up sitting with friends, drinking tea and having encouraging conversations; you learn to manage your time better and humble yourself by asking other students for their advice on an assignment; you learn to be flexible, adapt, and have patience as you spend thirteen days cooped up in your hallway with five people you hardly know (now I sure do!). The unexpected can be scary and annoying at times but also a God-given blessing.
- Embrace Your God-Given Abilities: Our last class was about community engagement. The third week we talked about being members of a team and of the Body of Christ. I'm learning a lot about myself: areas in which I need to grow and how to use the gifts God has given me to help grow the kingdom of Christ! It is so exciting to know that God has created each of us uniquely with the intention of using us for His glory! Embrace who God has made you to be, using your gifts and talents to share the Good News and witness to others what a wonderful God we have!
