WORKING ON 1 SAMUEL IN TAROK

We are just wrapping up another session with the Tarok team. We are going through First Samuel. We also have some counsultants-in-training working with us. As they gain more skills, the work in Tarok and other languages should move more quickly.

"ENEMIES"

It is not unusual here for people to feel that their "enemies" are the cause of the problems in their lives. While people are facing difficulties in relationships, finances, health, and other aspects of life, they are often quick to blame their problems on dark spiritual forces being cast on them by their enemies. They often look for power to overcome those forces, retaliate, and take revenge.

When we were looking at 1 Samuel 19.17, the expression "my enemy" seemed to jump out. The Tarok team explained that they can logically think of two kinds of enemy: opponents in war and people who are opposed to you in various other situations. And while David and King Saul were not exactly fighting a literal war against each other in 1 Samuel 19, the Tarok team felt that the expression *ukpa ìkum* 'companion in war/fighting' would be appropriate. Interestingly enough, the draft in Ikwerre has *nye irno m* 'person who hates me.'

PROVERBS IN YALA

In January we met with the Yala team to look at most of the book of Proverbs. Like many groups of people here, the Yala-speaking people have a large inventory of proverbs which they like to use. In addition to making for lively conversation, proverbs cause people to think about what the speaker is actually intending to say. Ferdinand Orji was a famous Yala translator, and he collected a number proverbs; here are some examples: Olichō je arī ɔpɔ̄pīya anɛ. "It is one who has climbed up on the palm

tree who is able to know if the palm fruits are really ripe for harvest." Iho yī inyi i jē inyi ni. "The load on the elephant's structure is never too much for him." Jyėsįs i tūuhwi yī lekpa yī adā yī nū ni. "The tiger's cub is never afraid of the father's forest." These proverbs are used in a variety of situations to emphasize a point.

In the book of Proverbs, wisdom is often portrayed as a wise woman. Proverbs 7:4 explains a good way to interact with wisdom: "Say to wisdom, 'You are my sister,' and call insight your intimate friend." Proverbs 8 goes further, with wisdom saying in verse 27, "When he [God] established the heavens, I was there" and in verse 35, "whoever finds me finds life." These statements correspond nicely with what St. Paul says in 1 Corinthians 1:25, that Christ is the "wisdom of God," and with what Jesus says in John 14:6: "I am the way, the truth, and the life." We are grateful for your prayers, encouragement, and support to get this message to people.
