
**SPRING 2022**

# WHAT WE ARE GOING THROUGH

Our private Facebook group "WAGNER UPDATES" carries the most recent updates.

Accepting Loss: A friend in Sierra Leone shed tears with me, Ruthie, as we reflected that I've never left well. "Clearly you were set up to stay for a long time," she said. We were settled. Each time I've left has felt like throwing things in bags and running out the door, and I wasn't even able to do the packing myself. Two evacuations were postpartum (during Ebola and with Lizzie's traumatic birth/tumor), another was in a medivac jet while Josiah's whooping cough kept stopping his breathing, and for the fourth, I'd been so sick for months that I could hardly get out of bed. All of these times we desired to stay, at least on some level, but had to leave. In the end, we know that He led us in and He has led us out. Blessed be His name.

Many thanks to colleagues and friends in Sierra Leone who used WhatsApp to painstakingly pack our house to hand back to our landlord. They have been sending luggage back via folks who are traveling back to the US. What a bittersweet process.

RECURRING SUPPORT THANK YOU! THANK YOU! THANK YOU! Our present challenge: Josh had planned to travel to Sierra Leone in September to clear out our house himself. But PTSD and OCD alongside his ADHD had become severe. The day before his trip to Sierra Leone, he had the first of three experiences of massive overwhelm that left him ineffective at managing even basic routines. It has been a scary time for us, and we were both on disability until Ruthie accepted this new position with LBT. Our focus has been on our kids and rebuilding healthy routines so that we can again serve as He wills.

# OUR MISSIONARY STATUS WITH LUTHERAN BIBLE TRANSLATORS (I.E. WHERE YOUR SUPPORT IS DIRECTED)

Ruthie is still a missionary with Lutheran Bible Translators, living on the support of friends, family, and churches. Josh is considered a support volunteer of our ministry, and he is looking for work. Josh is working outside of LBT for now. A pastor friend from our church responded to our grief and sense of guilt with not being "productive" by our standards. He said, "We commissioned and sent you. Now we will take care of you." \*queue buckets of tears, right?!\*

Each month we hoped and prayed that our support would hold on through our recovery, and we are humbled to say that it has. We don't deserve *your love and support*. Clearly you are responding to your own calls from the Lord. Our thanks is not enough. May He repay your kindness to us. To those few who have moved your support elsewhere, please know that we completely understand. Also, we apologize to those whose messages and emails to us have remained unanswered.

### WHAT'S AHEAD FOR OUR FAMILY?

Ruthie accepted a position as 1) Archive Curator, overseeing the checking, filing, and sharing of materials in the care of LBT. And as 2) Exegete for Tanzania projects, which will will be done remotely for now. She is starting by combing through training resources to compile lesson plans for video recordings which can hopefully be used by multiple teams of translators in Tanzania. Josh is considered a support volunteer of our ministry, and he is looking for work.

### THE THEMNE TRANSLATION PROJECT

The project is in good hands. In fact, the Themne translators and project are frequently used as models to assist other language projects. The picture below is of Themne Translator Mr. Kamara addressing and training a group of neighboring Loko language speakers. May God hold them and the work in the hands of capable translators, the Bible Society of Sierra Leone, and my dear friend Amy Formella (LBT Translation Advisor).
