






# PUT GOD'S WORD IN THEIR HANDS GO.LBT.ORG/SCHULTE

To which Erin and I responded together, "Here am I, send we.".

I stared blankly at Erin as my subconscious slowly ground from trying to memorize Hebrew vocabulary to trying to understand the question I'd just been asked.

"What's LBT," I finally replied.

Although this might not seem like the most auspicious of moments to begin our story of joining the mission of LBT, to put God's word in the hands of every person, this little question stands out quite large in both Erin and I's memory.

You see it hadn't been that long ago that Erin and I had first met, and I had my own question for her. I told her that after spending over 18 years living and working on the continent of Africa I knew, without a shadow of a doubt, that Africa was where God wanted me. My question? Could she see herself in Africa someday? Erin wasn't so sure.

The decision to move to an unfamiliar place, far from home, and radically different from the culture, climate, and context of everything she had ever known was a big ask to make of anyone, let alone a person you'd only just met.

In the weeks and months that followed, Erin had agonized over the idea of leaving her family, as well as her goals and dreams, to forge a very different future with, well, me. That's an even bigger ask, quite frankly.
