Earthquake Update

The earthquake in the Aleppo region greatly affected the people groups we are serving. To protect the safety of our translators, who either reside in the region, or periodically travel to the region, we won't go into specifics. The region has already seen so much hardship

and destruction of infrastructure due to the war and the earthquake was another major fiasco that they will need to work to recover from. Our team has informed us that no one involved with the project was injured, although many of our helpers have homes that have been damaged. The local churches we partner with have been helping a great deal with the recovery effort and have been offering shelter. Please keep the people of that region in your prayers.

Project Updates

The biggest ABT translation news is that the projects have worked out a way to find two qualified translation consultants. You might remember that ABT lost our previous two consultants, Dr. Harlow and Dr. Bennett and over the past two years we have been searching for replacements. ABT is partnering with SIL (a linguistics organization focused on Bible translation) to find qualified translation consultants for our projects. The Oreeta* project has begun working with a temporary translation consultant, who will evaluate the project needs. They are planning on meeting in person in June to go through Haggai and Malachi. As an example of how important this is, the book of Haggai, while tested with

community readers and team checked by our translators, would still not be publishable, even online, until it is checked over by a translation consultant. We are blessed to have a wonderful option to find consultants, which will allow us to begin publishing online as we go once again. Work with the exegetical advisor has been going great and he is planning on visiting the project in California this June, just before the translation consultant. The Sabelto cluster projects are also doing very well despite the challenges imposed by the earthquake. The teams continue to work via WhatsApp and are making progress. Their main struggles are due to the lack of electricity and internet in the regions they are working in.

Ministry Updates

Rob continues to serve as executive director for the Aramiac Bible Translation project (ABT). ABT recently had another board meeting in St. Louis, with many people calling in via Zoom. Our next meeting in September will be in person in Chicago at one of our language group's churches. It will be exciting to meet in person with the entire team in September and connect with the local church there. We are looking forward to good food and good
