Dear Friends,

This is an update on what I wrote in my February prayer letter.

I asked you to pray that Mandita would stay healthy. I'm happy to say that it seems that he has been in pretty good health in the recent months.

I asked you to pray that Terry and Cyndi Cirre would be able to return to Papua New Guinea. Thankfully they returned to PNG in early June for a two-month stay. This enabled them to help with wrapping up the Ipili work.

Trial copies of Ipili Genesis and a booklet containing the first five chapters of Ipili Exodus were typeset and printed. Mandita also requested that we print some copies of the Lutheran liturgy and catechism, and we were able to have that done. Mandita and his son Timoti traveled from the Ipili area to the translation center at Ukarumpa to take all the printed books and booklets to the Ipili area. We also bought some more audio Bible players and SD cards for them to take. Thank you for praying! Now everything is in the Ipili area.

My involvement with the Ipili language project finished at the end

of July. During August I will just need to do a couple of reports, and after that, I will be completely retired.

This is my last Borchard Prayer Letter. Recently I was thinking about what a privilege it has been for me to be involved in Bible translation work! Most of the time I just thought of it as the job I was doing, but, it has truly been a privilege that the Lord called me to do this important work. Not many Christians have had that opportunity. And the Lord gave you the opportunity to be partners in this work. Your prayers and
