Dear Friends in Christ,



In our last newsletter we mentioned that the Gokana translation team was working on preparing the book of Genesis so that a trial edition can be printed. The team has basically completed that task, and the printer is hard at work. Chuck and our International Associate, Rev. Linus Otronyi have been working with the Yala translation team. The Yala team recently produced a trial edition of Genesis. We heard that the printed books arrived in Yala at the end of November. Both of these languages have had New Testaments for some years. We are grateful to God for those who worked on those New Testaments, and we pray that God will bless the people's interaction with the foundational material in Genesis as well.

Transitions can be challenging, and this time was no exception. After leaving the US on the afternoon of Sunday, November 5th, we were above the Lagos airport in Nigeria on time to land at 6 pm on Monday. However, there was heavy rain, and then there was a medical emergency on board, then there was more rain. We finally got off the airplane at 1 am on Tuesday.

We thought we had made adequate preparations at home, but a few things needed some adjustments. We had a "panel beater" work on a few rust spots

on our car. It looked great, but the clutch pedal was on the floor. The generator

engine ran well, but it didn't produce electricity. The public power supply had his suit coat supplied a few too many volts during our absence, so a few things weren't functioning. On the positive

We had hoped to have that repaired the last time we traveled in 2019, but it didn't happen. Part of the reason is that oil-based paint emits a powerful odor for about a month here. This time a plaster/painter came while we were gone and came up with a creative solution to avoid the oil-based paint. That has been a big improvement.
