### New Relationships in Papua New Guinea

In January I was able to spend a little over a week in Papua New Guinea (PNG) with Sarah Esala (LBT Regional Director) and Michelle Gillard (Program Assistant). Sarah has been working on developing the relationship with the Evangelical Lutheran Church of Papua New Guinea (ELC-PNG) along with other Bible translation agencies. While there, we spent time with leaders from SIL-PNG, Bible Translation Association (BTA) (top right), and Seed Company. We were also able to meet with leaders from the Zaka circuit of the ELC-PNG where we are partnering on three translations (right). The Evangelical Lutheran Church of Papua New Guinea is the second-largest church in the country. I was given the opportunity to address their synod which meets once every other year (below). The synod voted to affirm the church council's decision to make Bible translation an official policy of the church. I am excited to see what comes of this collaboration between Bible translation organizations and the church where LBT has been asked to take a leading role.
