Okpoma, Nigeria - August 7, 2025: Fifty-five hours, three plane rides, a guest house, and a five hour car ride on Red Clay Roads brought me to my first country in Africa. Night two at 11:00 PM. was dark, hot and humid. I awoke in a bed outfitted with a bug net. I got up and paced for 90 minutes. Uncontrolled crying followed. "What did I get myself into? I want to go home. Lord, help me." I repeated those words hundreds times. I was broken, because I was in an unfamiliar place and a load of emotions that overtook me. By God's grace, the U.S. is six hours behind us, and family, friends, & LBT supporters were awake. I poured my heart full of loneliness and fear out to them. Then a text: "The Lord's loving kindness indeed never ceases. For His compassions never fail. They are new every morning. Great is Your faithfulness." The tears minimized; I slept. I awoke early to a slight breeze and a hot breakfast waiting. New mercies from our Heavenly Father. I had never known brokenness so deep that it brought me to uncontrollable tears but when it happened, I knew it wasn't random. It had purpose. Let go and let God do His thing. Wow, did He do His thing!
