Our church kindly sent soccer balls, children's Bible story books, dolls, and matchbox cars as gifts to churches and families. Elijah chose John 20:31 to print and share.

# ORAL BIBLE STORYTELLING (OBS)

Last year Lutheran Bible Translators and the two diocese of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Tanzania adopted a strategy called Oral Bible Storytelling (OBS). This has been an effective approach to introduce communities to God's Word. In August, I participated in a workshop where teams from different language communities (Taturu, Kerewe, Sakuma, Sumbwa, and Kara) came together to craft stories from *Genesis* into their languages. These stories are then taken back to their communities, shared, and taught, so that they can touch people's lives and plant seeds of desire for more of God's Word.

# **DOCTORATE OF MINISTRY • BIBLE TRANSLATION**

# Ruthie, why are you getting a doctorate?



One of the requirements of getting certified as a Translation Consultant in Lutheran Bible Translators is holding a type of doctorate, and I have been asked to prioritize getting this certification.

# Why did you choose this program?

I wanted a conservative, evangelical school committed to the authority of Scripture and mission of the Gospel. Being ecumenical and internationally diverse were also benefits. I wanted a program that could be done remotely in conjunction with my work. I have three colleagues in Lutheran Bible Translators who have had good experiences with this program and are now serving as Translation Consultants. **The program is crafted for students working full-time in Bible translation** and my classmates are from and/or serve around the world.

# If you're attending a seminary, will you get ordained?

No. While there are some overlapping topics, such as biblical interpretation, my focus is on the context of Bible translation.

# How long is it going to take you to finish?

I've started my second year of three years of coursework! After the three years I need to complete my final project, which is not as extensive as a typical dissertation, but will certainly take time, likely another year. I hope to complete my program in 2028/2029.

# Ruthie, how can I pray for you in your studies?

There is much to read, write, discuss, and learn! It feels impossible to do it all and prioritizing is crucial. Please pray for wisdom and focus. May the Lord bring to light what would be most beneficial for my work, further development, and contribution to this field of Bible translation. Pray also for my family as we figure out how to support one another.

# What are some of the books you are reading?

My first year focused on Biblical Interpretation and Theology in Global and Historical Contexts. We focused on context and language—how theology, history, and culture shape both Scripture and its translation. We studied methods and approaches—looking at hermeneutics, ethics, and the global Church, and how all of these influence the way we interpret and translate the Bible. From my recent reading, I would recommend:
