I love our traditions of giving and receiving gifts around Christmas. I know it can get overly materialistic, but at its heart, gift giving can be a great way to honor the best gift ever to enter the world, Jesus. I've been studying the Gospel of Luke lately, and I am constantly surprised by the gifts that Jesus accepts from people. God's incarnation is not just a gift he is giving; it's a series of gifts he's receiving too. God humbles himself enough to be born as a human baby. God comes into the world through Mary, accepting her hospitality as she carries God in her own body. God is gracious enough to allow a human family to love and feed him. Eventually, Jesus accepts meals and lodging and support for his ministry from women, from disciples, from pharisees, and from tax collectors. Jesus accepts what people are willing to offer him. Jesus teaches and preaches and blesses and saves those who welcome him.
