The Year in Review

2025 has been a year packed full of opportunities! Here's a brief round-up of the major things that have kept Chris and Janine busy and out of trouble during the last 12 months:

- Chris taught **three different classes**: Semantics, Practicum of Bible Translation, and also an NT Greek class to MA students.
- Janine worked with our six projects to organize and systematize grant proposals, to help LBT see the financial needs of our Bible translation partners and how we can best help.
- Chris worked with three different teams to exegetically check **13 books of the Bible**.
- Janine organized an international training event here in Addis Ababa, hosting more than 20 Bible translation workers from five different countries.
- Chris worked with interns from Ethiopia and across Africa in a new program to raise a new generation of translation workers proficient in Biblical language, linguistics, translation theory, and more.

- Janine visited our three down-country projects each quarter to gather important information about project progress and help them plan effectively for future work.
- Chris helped conduct a training workshop for eleven graduates being sent out to help their communities to hear and engage with Scripture in their own languages.
- Janine is **working with the leadership** of the Ethiopian church's Bible translation division to improve planning, reporting, and budgeting for coming years.
- Janine also put up with Chris *almost every* single day of 2025!

We are so grateful for the work we have been able to accomplish this year to help bring the Bible into the languages of Ethiopia.

We are likewise grateful to you, our supporters, who have given us the financial means to carry out this ministry and are also praying for us and the people we serve.

Volunteer Sean

In August, Sean moved back to Zambia for a seven-month stint working as a volunteer for our friends' charity organization, *Pamodzi Ndi Ana* ("Together with Children"). Pamodzi helps children in many areas, with a focus on kids with special needs, such as customfitted "all-terrain" wheelchairs.

The team often travels to other parts of the country to follow up on the 600+ children who have wheelchairs already, to do repairs and adjust them as the kids grow. Pamodzi is the only organization in Zambia that makes these follow-up visits every year.

Sean is really enjoying his role as a general handyman, assembling and modifying wheelchairs, keeping vehicles in order, helping to install water pumps in remote villages, checking out building sites for future nursery schools and playgrounds, and whatever else is needed around Pamodzi.
