"How much is enough?"

I (Martin) once asked this question of a group of Kwanja Christians in Cameroon. I was personally challenged when a community leader said that if his family could harvest one ton of corn in a year, that could be enough for his family's humble needs. **But how much of God's Word in his language is ENOUGH?**

The New Testament is only about a quarter of the Bible. When a people group have only the New Testament in their language, is it really enough?

The Cameroon Lutheran Church works with Lutheran Bible Translators and other partners to reach more people in their own languages. Over the years, Lutherans in Cameroon have participated in completing more than 12 New Testaments and two full Bibles. Currently, three teams of national translators from three language groups (who now have New Testaments) are working to translate full Bibles. At least five other language groups with New Testaments are "knocking at the door", wanting help to translate full Bibles in their languages.

We are excited to hear of a new hunger among the Wa-wa people of Cameroon, who until recently were considered "unreachable", threatening to kill anyone among them who converted to Christ. Our son Sammy and his partners recently distributed audio recordings they had done of six books of the Bible to 13 Wawa villages. Now, as they listen to God's Word for the first time in their own language, the Wa-wa villagers are amazed at "how sweet" the message of Jesus really is! Pray that God will protect and strengthen them as new believers.

Are we going back to Cameroon again?

We (Martin and Joan) have been invited again by the Cameroon Lutheran Church to share "Passion and Vision", to inspire and help train Cameroonian Bible Translators to "See to it that you complete the ministry to which God has called you." (Col. 4:17)

We plan to leave for Cameroon December 8th. We will visit our son Sammy, Kelsey, and their 4 children for Christmas, and then work with national translation and literacy workers in the Cameroon Lutheran Church projects in January through February:

- To encourage national translators, literacy workers, and the directors overseeing them in the Cameroon Lutheran Church.
- To help coordinate another Translators' Conference for several language teams who are translating the Scriptures into their own languages.

- Continuing safety, health and strength as we engage in another LBT Cameroon ministry trip.
- God's wisdom as He equips and uses us to help and encourage others who continue the work.
- Safe travels: We plan to leave the US Dec. 8th, to return Feb. 25th.
- The planning and preparation for the second Translators Conference early next year. Pray for wisdom for us to help national translators share with one another and do excellent work.
- The Subula translators and literacy workers, that we may help and encourage them in literacy and translation.
- Blessings on our Christmas season with our son Sammy and his family in Cameroon.
- Many more people to come to the Lord before it is too late—in Canada, the US, Cameroon, and throughout the world!
